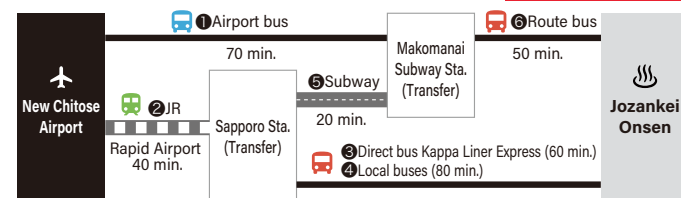
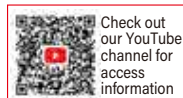

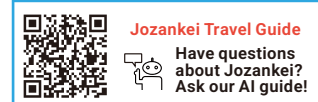

### Jozankei Onsen

Often called "netsu no yu" (hot spring for heat), Jozankei Onsen's sodium components adheres to the skin to seal heat in and warm you up from the inside, making you sweat to detox your body, improve joints and ease your stress.

### Hoheikyo Onsen

Known as "bijin no yu" (hot spring for beautifying), the calcium/sodium hydrogen carbonated water of Hoheikyo Onsen makes your skin soft while washing away sebum and impurities for a smooth and clean finish.

### Koganeyu Onsen

Called "shinzo no yu" (hot spring for the heart), the sulphuric nature of Koganeyu Onsen boosts blood circulation and expands blood vessels, helping to burn sugar and fat in the blood and effective against for metabolic syndrome and lifestyle-related diseases.

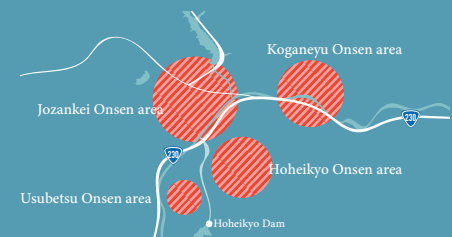
### Usubetsu Onsen

Known as "bihada no yu" (hot spring for beautiful skin), the calcium/sodium hydrogen carbonated water of Usubetsu Onsen makes your skin soft and clean by removing dead skin cells and dirt in the pores.



## Four types of natural hot springs created by the power of nature

The ground water under the rich forests of Jozankei selected as one of the 100 Best Water Source Forests by the Forestry Agency, became the hot spring source of Jozankei Onsen, Koganeyu Onsen, and Hoheikyo Onsen, Usubetsu Onsen. It is said that bathing in naturally gushing hot springs such as Jozankei Onsen and Koganeyu Onsen is beneficial, yet their efficacy is unknown. Enjoy the richness and quality of the hot spring water of this region.

## History of Jozankei

The hot spring opened by Miizumi Jozan has been healing people until today.

Jozankei Onsen was named after Miizumi Jozan, a monk who devoted his life to clearing the way for therapeutic hot spring baths in this area and laid the foundation for the present day Jozankei Onsen. In 1866, Miizumi Jozan discovered a hot spring in the upper reaches of the Toyohira river. In a bare rocky valley with not even a path to come and go, and within an overgrown thickly verdant primeval forest along the upper reaches of the Toyohira river Jozan discovered a natural hot spring source. He moved into this unexplored area, taking great pains and even forgetting to eat and sleep, to develop therapeutic hot spring baths to take care of the sick and injured. Miizumi Jozan's enthusiasm soon moved people, a road was constructed and word spread of Jozankei Onsen.

Jozankei Onsen is located just under 1 hour (26 km) by car from downtown Sapporo, in a greenery-filled valley in Shikotsu-Toya National Park. Over its history of more than 155 years, it has become a popular spot among Sapporo locals because of its proximity to the city. The abundant nature surrounding Jozankei shows a new face with every season—no matter when you visit, you'll be met with new scenery that takes your breath away.



### 1 Futami-tsuribashi Suspension Bridge

This bright red suspension bridge is an iconic landmark of Jozankei. Take in stunning views of colorful fall foliage at Futamiwa, referencing Ise's famous Futamiura (Meotowa - the "Husband and Wife Boulders") and the Kappabuchi Pool.

**Legend of Kappa**  
Legend has it that a young man was fishing in Kappabuchi Pool when suddenly he fell to the bottom of the river as if he had been pulled in. A year later, he appeared in his father's dreams and said "I am happily married to a kappa (river deity) and we have children." It is said that no one has drowned there since.

**← Akaiwa-no-kan**  
Located upstream by the walking path, this canyon's exposed rock faces are a beautiful rusty red because of the iron in them. You'll feel like you've stepped into another world!

### 2 Futami Jozan Road

(Futami Park~Futami-tsuribashi Suspension Bridge~Kappa Buchi~Akaiwa-no-kan)

This nature trail runs along the Toyohira River from Futami-tsuribashi Suspension Bridge. The lush forest in the national park is home to wild birds and over 600 species of wild grasses. You can admire colorful leaves in mid-October and take a snowshoe tour in winter.

### 3 Hoheikyo Dam

This arched dam has been selected for the Top 100 Water Resource Forests and Top 100 Dam Lakes. The columnar joints in the rock face and the fall foliage reflected on Lake Jozan are among Sapporo's most spectacular sights. You can even watch water being discharged in a thrilling rush.

### 4 Named after Sapporo City, this mountain stands 1293 m tall. With steep inclines and walks through streams, you'll feel a real sense of accomplishment after scaling this one!

Many a hiker braves this mountain to enjoy the captivating views from the summit and Typhoon Plateau—you can see the mountains in central Hokkaido and the whole of Sapporo City!

### Hand Baths and Foot Baths

Free hand baths and foot baths with Jozankei's soothing spring water are available throughout the resort for you to enjoy.

### Jozan Gensen Park

This park is restored to look just the way it did when Miizumi Jozan first discovered this hot spring in the 19th century. In addition to a foot bath, there's an egg-boiling spring (Ontama-no-yu) where you can enjoy the Japanese tradition of boiling eggs in natural hot spring water.

### Iwato Kannondo

This temple is known for its healing energy. Built by businessman and politician Uzaburo Chizaki II in 1936, 33 statues of Kannon, the Buddhist goddess of mercy, stand throughout the cave extending around 120 m from the main hall.

### Shiraito-no-Taki

This small waterfall is created by the backwater of Jozankei Power Station, the oldest working hydroelectric power station in Hokkaido. The summer greenery and colorful fall foliage are a beautiful sight.

### View from Jozankei-ohashi Bridge

Jozankei-ohashi Bridge is the biggest bridge in Jozankei. You can see the whole hot spring resort in all its seasonal glory, making this a prime photo spot.

### The summit of this mountain offers an incredible view of Lake Sapporo right below. Be warned—the trail from Jozankei Dam Downstream Park is steep with lots of stairs! This mountain is comparatively low, but you'll still feel that sense of pride when you persevere and reach the top!

### Sapporo Kokusai Ski Resort

Take a 30-minute drive from the hot spring resort and enjoy some of the best powder snow in Hokkaido! In fall you can take a gondola up the mountain to enjoy the colorful leaves. You'll be greeted by a panoramic view of Otaru and the Sea of Japan when you reach the summit.

### Jozankei Dam

Hokkaido's tallest gravity dam! When you look at it from the Downstream Park, you'll be amazed by its scale. Along the route from Jozankei to Otaru (Prefectural Road 1), you'll find four viewpoints that offer stunning views of Lake Sapporo and the mountains.

### View from Nishiki Bridge

Located where the Toyohira River and Shirai River meet, Maizuru-no-Toro is a top spot for fall foliage. Head under Nishiki Bridge, row out onto the water in a canoe, and enjoy the incredible view. It's also a paradise for wild bird watchers.

### Mt. Hakkenzan ("Eight Sword Mountain")

Named after its eight jagged peaks of rock. From the top you can see a 360-degree view, including downtown Sapporo in the distance.

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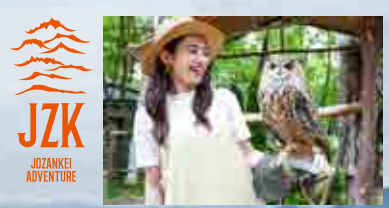

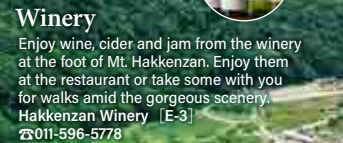
### Play in the snow!

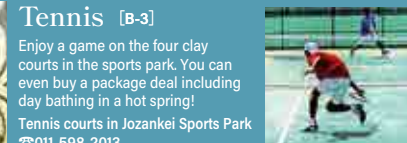
